Dear Community NAPLAN

Thank you to all of the students who completed the various tests from NAPLAN testing last week. We are very proud of the magnificent efforts that you all made. The students will complete the numeracy test tomorrow, and we will use the next couple of days to catch up any students who missed their scheduled time for their test.

Later in the year, parents will receive individual test results so they will know how their child has performed. We will use the overall results to compare our school against similar schools, the Tasmanian and Australian average and use individual results to analyse how each student performed on each test. School test results are then used to set school priorities and learning programs for the following year.

Mid-Year Progress Reports (Prep - Grade 6)

In this term teachers will be continuing to review children's work as they write the mid-year progress reports. Parent—teacher meetings will then be held in the second last week of the term. These will provide an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss the progress that children have made so far, along with the goals that have been set for the remainder of the year for each child and ways in which families can help their child succeed at school.

The assessments in each area for Grades 3-6 will be based around an A-E rating. The Prep - 2 children will receive a report using written descriptors instead of A-E ratings. Parents should be extremely pleased if their child receives a C as this means that their child is achieving the new 'high' standard. Children who achieve a D are working towards the standard and may achieve the standard by the end of the year. As each grade has a new set of expectations that the children have to meet, the children may achieve a lower rating than last year. This does not mean that they are not achieving, but that they haven't shown the evidence to achieve the same rating at the higher level. If your child receives a D or an E it is highly important that you make an appointment with their class teacher to find out how you can help support your child to achieve a higher rating.

School Rules and Bullying

Our school rules encourage our students to show care and respect for others which helps to create a safe and kind playground. Unfortunately, there are times where children are not so kind to each other and this can be perceived as bullying. A child is considered to have been bullied when they have been hurt or upset by someone else on purpose.

Bullying can take the following forms:

Physical (body)

Verbal (words)

Social (group)

In the event a child feels that they are being bullied, we encourage the use of the 'Turn, Talk and Tell' triangle. When bullying or teasing first starts to occur, we encourage children to try and *turn* away, that is to ignore what's being done. If this doesn't work, children are then encouraged to *talk* to the perpetrator by asking them to stop and telling them that what they are doing is against the school rules. If the bullying or

teasing continues then the third step is to tell an adult, i.e. report what's happening to a teacher or parent so that they can intervene. If children don't feel they can tell anyone, they are also able to name the bully through filling in a 'Bully Buster' sheet at school, which is located near the office. Once a sheet is filled in, teachers follow this up with both the victim and the bully. These students' names are entered into our computer database so that we can identify any patterns that are starting to emerge. Most importantly, parents can help us to combat bullying. If you believe that your child is being bullied, please contact the school immediately. Today the eldest child in the family will come home with a Bullying No Way! parent information card which has handy tips and resources for you to use. Children in Grade 3-6 will also be given a Bullying No Way! student card.

It is also important that you encourage your children to solve problems in an assertive rather than aggressive way. If they are choosing to feel angry because someone did something that they didn't like, then by using the language of MYTERN, we would like them to identify that they are on a red road and that they need to use a PET – (Personal Emotional Tool) to help them remain or get back in control.

Cross Country Carnival

Our school cross country will be held on Wednesday 2nd June for Prep - Grade 6 students and will commence at about 11:30 a.m. on the foreshore at the Village Green beginning with the Grade 6 students. Grades 5 and 6 run 3 km, Grades 3 and 4 run 2 km, Grade 1 and 2 run 1.2 km and Prep run 900m. As we are holding it on a new course we will be walking the students through on Wednesday 26th May (weather permitting).

Parents and friends are most welcome to attend to encourage the children in their races, however due to COVID-19 restrictions, we will have similar rules to the athletic carnival. Parents must remain outside the orange fence around the students and speak to a staff member first if they need to speak with their child. Please follow all school staff instructions, and practice social distancing.

We still need more parent volunteers on check points. Please advise the school office if you can assist. The School Association will be running a barbecue selling sausages for \$2. Online Qkr! orders only.

Information about how to order your children/s sausage on Qkr! went home today on the back of the Cross Country Parent letter. Online orders must be made by next Wednesday 26th May by 12:00 p.m.

Thank you to all volunteers who demolished the old boat on the weekend. Special mention to Jacob Bayles and Dean Hughes for donating their heavy machinery and time to the project. We hope to have the new boat installed in the coming weeks, weather permitting.
