## Dear Community Positive Partnerships

Creating positive partnerships between home and school is critical to the students' learning and wellbeing. All staff within the school are working at all times to achieve the best outcomes for the children in our care. If you have any concerns about your child/ren it is important to notify the school or contact the class teacher so that it can then be followed up to maximise children's learning and emotional development.

#### Stop, Drop and Go Zone

A reminder to all parents that it is a Stop, Drop and Go Zone ONLY on South Street the street, outside the school office. Drivers are to drop off their children and go, or remain in their vehicles at all times whilst waiting for children. Parents are also reminded to close any gates that they pass through to help keep the students safe.

#### Attendance - "Miss School - Miss Out"

I wish to reiterate to parents the importance of your child's attendance at school every day, unless they are unwell. By not being at school, even for one day, a child can miss out on important lessons that might mean they experience difficulty down the track. Please ensure wherever possible that appointments are out of school hours or in holidays and only extraordinary events should result in school non-attendance. When your child is absent it is very important that you phone, email or write a note to the school report your child's absence.

You can maximise your children's learning by:

- ensuring they attend every day,
- providing them with a healthy breakfast,
- ensuring they receive adequate sleep and
- providing them with healthy snacks/meals and water.

This will help to sustain their thinking and learning throughout the day.

The following procedures will be followed for any child who has an unexplained absence:

- SMS text will be sent.
- If no response then this will be followed with a phone call.
- In the event there are five unexplained absences a letter will be sent out asking parents to explain all of the absences.
- If no response, then the Department of Education may take legal action.

If your child is absent then please refer to the accompanying sheet for the list of authorised reasons for children to be excused from school.

#### Social Skill Focus - Manners

It's very important that children use their manners when communicating with other people. Some ways in which they can use manners include: Saying Please — when you are asking someone for something or to do something. Saying Thank you — when you receive something from someone. Saying Excuse me - when you are passing someone, or to leave a room, or to get someone's attention in order to ask them something. Saying Pardon me - when you didn't hear something someone said and you want them to repeat it.
