Australian Mathematics Competition

Once again Bridport was able to offer an extension opportunity this year to students in the area of Mathematics.

23 students from the primary grades entered the internationally renowned mathematics competition to test their knowledge and problem-solving skills.

Congratulations to all students on their endeavours. Our results show that 7 students gained proficiency certificates; meaning they displayed a satisfactory level of mathematics and problem solving. 4 students received credits, 3 students achieved distinctions and one student accomplished a high distinction. This was achieved by student James Coxen who was in the top 3% of Grade 5 participants. Students' scores were in relation to other participants of similar ages who entered from across Tasmania.

Grade 5/6 Transition Visit to Scottsdale High School

Our Grade 5/6 students will be travelling to the high school on Wednesday I0th November as part of the Grade 6-7 transition program. The students will travel together on a bus to and from our school as a group. Bridport Primary School Reading Expo

On Wednesday 27th October, a successful Reading Expo was held at Bridport Primary School. Two sessions were held on the day, from 3:15 - 4:15 p.m. and 6:00—7:00 p.m., in order to provide options for families to attend at a time which was more convenient for them.

Each class group created activities and showcased the learning which has been undertaken around the central theme of children engaging with and enjoying books.

Some students showcased some of the artwork they had created in response to Sea Country, by Auntie Patsy Cameron, and participants had a try at threading shell necklaces.

One group of students provided an art activity around the book Lightning Jack, by Glenda Millard, while another group provided dioramas of clues relating to books that they had read and ran a competition to see who could guess the correct book title.

Other activities included an interactive display of jokes and riddles, a book character hunt through the popular picture books by author Julia Donaldson, and a "Who am I?" character walk.

There was a Charlie and the Chocolate Factory station, where students and their families could design their own chocolate bar wrappers and test their skill at the chocolate bar claw machine.

One class provided video book reviews using digital technology, while another provided their written reviews with tear-off tabs so that people could look into reading that book for themselves.

Another group provided a competition where students had to guess the book character from their silhouettes.

A photo booth was set up, and participants could become book cover stars by having have their photo printed on the cover of some famous books.

An interactive display of the school's book currently being written with input from all grades was also able

to be viewed on the night.

Libraries Tasmania staff were also in attendance, sharing information about the services they can offer to families, as were staff from the 26 Ten program, promoting their offerings in supporting adult literacy. These links between the school and the community have proved invaluable in showcasing the services and opportunities out there in our local community in the area of promoting literacy throughout the wider community.

The newly-revamped Library space was the setting for a book-themed Scavenger Hunt. We had a Book Fair, which raised money towards increasing our Library book collection. Guest readers from the community volunteered to read aloud to groups of students on the stage throughout each session, with family favourites being shared and enjoyed.

A large number of our school community attended one of the sessions, with some even coming back for both sessions!


North East Junior Cricket 2021/2022
