# Positive Behaviour Support

We have worked extremely hard to develop a strong, supportive school environment that focuses on the rewarding of students who are displaying positive behaviours. This is known as 'Positive Behaviour Support' (PBS). A key part of PBS has been the development of our three easily understood school rules/expectations: Be Safe, Be Fair and Show Care. Listed below are some ways in which we encourage and reward children:

PBS Raffle: Children are awarded raffle tickets when they are exhibiting positive behaviours. Children then place the raffle tickets in the PBS raffle box. A number of tickets are then drawn out at the end of each week. The winners then choose a prize from the PBS prize box.

Certificates: These are given for special achievements. Children may be awarded a Merit Certificate based around our values of Growth, Respect, Aspiration and Courage, which incorporates outstanding work or excellent behaviour.

These initiatives are in addition to the positive comments and individual classroom reward systems that are in operation in each class. We urge all parents to encourage their children to strive towards continuous improvement in their school work and to display exemplary behaviour in order to maximise their development. Together we can then celebrate their success.

#### Mobile Phones and Smart Watches

Please remind your children that if they choose to bring a mobile phone to school, then they need to hand it into the office for the day for safekeeping. This is in line with our Department of Education and school Mobile Phone Policy — 'Off and Away All Day'. Any students wearing smart

#### **NEW CHANGES TO HAYFEVER ADVICE**

Public Health has reviewed their advice about hay fever in the current COVID-19 environment.

Hay fever symptoms are similar to COVID-19 symptoms, so its important families know what they need to do if their child experiences hay fever symptoms.

If your child has hay fever symptoms, please keep them at home and test for COVID-19 using a rapid antigen test (RAT).


If your child tests negative on a RAT and symptoms continue, Public Health advises that you must do a second RAT 24 hours later, or seek a PCR test.

If the second RAT or PCR remains negative, this is sufficient evidence for your child to return to school if they feel well.

If symptoms change or increase in severity, please see your treating medical practitioner for review.

Please know that Public Health advice can change at short notice, and we appreciate your patience as we respond to these changes as quickly as possible.
