The lessons start around 2:00 p.m., with the free family event to mark the opening of the skate park getting underway with a primary students' flag procession from around 5:00 p.m.



### FAMILY LEARNING PACKS

Learning in Families Together (LIFT) is a free program for parents and carers with children in Kindergarten to Grade 2. As a parent, you are one of your child's most important teachers. When it comes to what your child is learning at school, it can be hard to know how to support that learning at home - but help is at hand! When schools and families work together, the benefits for children's learning is great!





To help families help children to learn at home and at school, Bridport Primary School has developed a large library of Family Learning Packs, which are bags of fun activities for children to borrow and use at home to support their learning. These resources have been developed since 2016 with funding provided to the LIFT (Learning in Families Together) program and are continually being added to each year.

These packs can be sent home by class teachers for families to use as needed. If you have something in particular that your child is practising at home, such as telling the time, handwriting, reading sight words, etc., feel free to ask your child's class teacher if there may be a Family Learning Pack to help with that particular aspect of their learning.
