Communicating Learning Progress with Families Interviews Term 3 2022

This is an additional and very important opportunity to discuss your child's learning progress after the summative midyear report went home late last term, as the end of year report will contain no comments.

You have the choice of having this conversation face to face or over the phone at the chosen time. Once again, we are using an online system to book these interviews.

The interviews have been scheduled for approximately 15 minutes. If you require extra time beyond the 15 minutes or have any difficulties meeting in these times, please contact the school office. You can book appointments using the following steps from Monday 29th August at 3:00 p.m. Online bookings close on Friday 9th September at 12:00 p.m.



How to book my interview

Step 1: Open online page in your internet browser:

www.schoolinterviews.com.au

Step 2: Click on the 'Make a Booking' button. The school code is 9 inrk

Step 3: Complete the booking form/your profile with your email address, your name and your child's name. From the drop-down box, choose the appointment type preference of either "Face to Face" or "Phone". A confirmation email will be sent to the email address you supply here.

Step 4: Choose your child's classroom teacher from the drop-down box.

Step 5: Click on the day and time you would like your booking.

Step 6: You will now receive an email with confirmation of your appointments and what to do if you need to change them for any reason. Please take notice of the extra information in this email regarding extra precautions due to COVID-19. If you need to add another student return to your profile and click "add another student" You will not receive a text reminder so, please put the date in your diary.
