
- I. To order your photos log onto www.leadingimage.com.au

- 4. If you are ordering student photos, click on the "student" button.
- 5. Enter your child's name correctly. You do not need to nominate your child's class. Leave the "folder" field blank.
- 6. Enter your full name and contact details on the "Your Details" page.
- 7. Choose your products and proceed to view the cart.
- 8. To order for other children press "add another student" and follow steps 3-7 again. When ordering for family photos, press the "family" button on the first page, and follow the above steps.
- 9. To complete your purchase, view your cart, add your payment details and process.
- 10. Once processed, you will receive a confirmation of your order to your nominated email address.
